(Article 81). Censorship is not allowed. Obstructing or interfering with the activities of mass media is a cause of responsibility according to the law. (Article 82). [1]

Article 5 of the Law of the Republic of Uzbekistan "On Mass Media" (new version) is entitled "Freedom of Mass Media", and its second clause is as follows: "Anyone, unless otherwise provided by law if he is not arrested, he has the right to appear in the mass media, to publicly express his opinion and belief". Currently, the mass media are performing a number of tasks not only as a means of informing the society, but also as a means of controlling the state's activities from the point of view of the interests of the society

This is from such vices, all kinds of threats, from the influence of foreign ideas in order to protect our youth, the upper chamber of the Oliv Majlis, i.e. the


